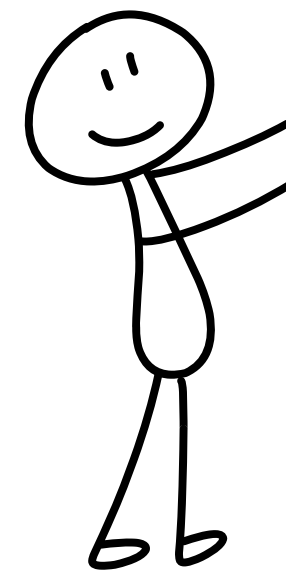

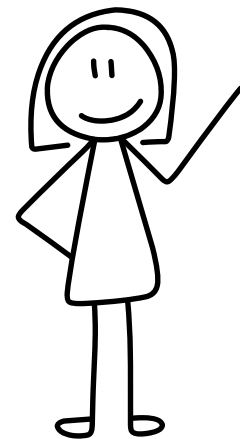

Definition: Someone who is the teacher's favorite and often gets better because of it.


Example: Juliet was the teacher's pet; she never got in trouble for tardy even though she was late almost daily.

HOW TO GET THIS PRESENTATION TO SCROLL FROM A TV SCREEN/WITHOUT A COMPUTER

- 1st-Make sure you have the "After" amount set for the same time (this is in seconds)
- 2nd-Take off the checkmark next to "On Mouse Click"
- 3rd-Go to "File" then "Export"
- 4th-Click on "Create a Video"
- 5th-Click on "Presentation Quality"
- 6th-Pick either "Use Recorded Timings & Narration" if you want to use the timings in the 1st step OR "Don't Use Recorded Timings & Narrations" if you want to set the time between slides now
- Next direction on next slide

The Dewey Decimal system is a classification system used to organize nonfiction books within libraries. It was created in 1837 by Melvil Dewey. Today, some libraries continue to use Dewey's system while others utilize more inclusive organization systems.

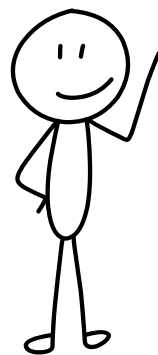


FUN FACTS: MATH
